Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2015-16 educational progress for the Marlette Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2016-17 year, no new Priority or Focus schools were named; some Priority or Focus schools did exit their status because they met the exit criteria. New Reward schools were identified using school rankings and Beating the Odds information. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Marlette Elementary School's staff continues to battle the consequences of poverty and the negative effects it has on academic achievement. We have a full-time social worker and have started the move to Conscious Discipline as a district. Until an assessment can measure the true value of a child, we will continue educating the whole child and do our best to help every student achieve and exceed our high expectations, academically and behaviorally.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

2014 & 2015- Resident pupils in grades K-6 are assigned to Marlette Elementary School, as well as K-6 pupils applying under Schools of Choice.

2014 & 2015- Marlette Elementary School continues to focus on student growth and proficiency in ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies. We have a full-time school social worker and have also started implementing Conscious Discipline (2016).

A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

2014 & 2015- In addition to offering an exceptional grades K-6 experience, Marlette Elementary School also offers a Young 5's program, a tuition-based preschool, and a Great Start Readiness Program preschool (GSRP). We now offer before and after school care as well as several after school clubs.
